1. Woodredding Farm (GR SO640298) ([///lookout.steadily.handfuls](#))

10.30am – 5pm. Low volume, award-winning maker of cider and perry made in the traditional way. See how a small-scale cider maker can use both old and new technology and get tips on how to make your own cider. Walk around our traditional cider orchard and our perry pear orchard in sight of May Hill (said to be essential for good perry!). Draught and bottled cider and perry for sale with free tastings to help make your choice. Sausage baps, tea, coffee and soft drinks available

2. Lyne Down Organics (GR SO646312) (HR8 2NT) ([///vented.overhaul.redeeming](#))

10am – 6pm (11.30pm Sat). Explore a traditional orchard with over 30 different apple varieties. Meet the donkeys and traditional Ryeland sheep. Soak up the views of May Hill and the Malverns from the hay meadow. Cider tastings and pressings throughout the weekend. Licensed bar and hot and cold food options, cake and real coffee. Cider, perry, apple juice, apple cider vinegar and jam for sale. Celebrate Harvestime on Saturday evening with Blackthorn Ritualistic Folk. Bar open till late

10am to 6.30pm. New shop area and Scrumpy House Restaurant open with special site-only offers. New tasting room with Guided Mill Tours at 11am, 12.30pm, 2pm and 3.30pm (+5pm Saturday only). Adults £15, Children £6, Family £36. Book in advance on 01531 660 108 to avoid disappointment on the day. Play area open. 5. Much Marcle Memorial Hall (GR SO658330) ([///engine.quietly.soggy](#))

11am - 5pm. Serving hot drinks, soup and roll lunches and afternoon tea and cake. Produce stall in Bob Dallow Room. Look out for the Archery Fun Shoot across the road at The Bartons on Saturday.

6. St Bartholomew's Church (GR SO657327) ([///blaze.develops.masts](#))

10.30am – 5pm Church open for visitors all weekend. Exhibition of paintings by Howard Mayell. Small exhibition of crafts by the Trumpet Craft Group. Bell Ringing Saturday, Harvest Festival service Sunday morning.

7. Hellens (GR SO661332) ([///copies.quote.regularly](#))

11am – 5pm Entry to Hellens site £2.50 (children free). A Feast of Apples – displays of apples, cider fruit and perry pears; tastings of dessert and culinary fruit. Sales of less usual varieties of apples, apple juice and cider, apple trees (Saturday only). Organisations taking part: Tools for Self Reliance Cymru, Herefordshire Wildlife Trust, Herefordshire Beekeepers. Other activities: Tool sharpening, Pressing the perry pears, using Hellens own ancient traditional mill (11am and 2pm) Laughing Betsy (Sunday only). 8. Awnells Farm (GR SO658319) (HR8 2NW) ([///surfacing.crackling.situated](#))

10.30am – 5pm Walk through the ancient cider and perry pear orchards. Meet our closed herd of traditional Hereford cattle dating back 170 years, together with Golden Guernsey goats, Shetland and Greyface Dartmoor sheep, and a Shetland pony. Midlands Air Ambulance will be with us again. Display of Vintage engines in operation. Jolly G's ice cream made fresh on the farm and Hereford beef burgers from Awnells' home herd will be available.

9. Gregg's Pit (GR SO662323) (HR8 2NL) ([///plotting.mainframe.twinge](#))

10.30am – 6pm Craft cider and perry making in a traditional orchard. Meet the makers, celebrate their 30th harvest, walk among the standard trees, learn about the vintage fruit and watch the pressing. Taste and buy sparkling, still and draught cider/perry from the bar. Ploughman's lunches and cakes by Country Made Catering of Ross-on-Wye. **No dogs in orchard** please but may be exercised under owners' control in car park area.

Grid references are accurate to 100m. Postcodes are provided where navigation apps will take you near to the venue – typically within 200m. We have omitted postcodes where they do not take you close to the venue or provide misleading directions.
